Wet Winter -- Weedy Spring

With the fantastic wet winter that New Mexico received, are you seeing new types of plants sprouting in your yard and landscaping? Listed below are a few that we have seen growing in Socorro.



←Kochia. Annual introduced from Europe. Can be grazed when the plant is young.

Spiny Souwthistle.—
Annual that is native to Europe.
Found along roadsides and in gar-
dens.



←African Rue. Perennial native of North Africa. First found in Deming, NM in 1928. This plant is toxic and is a listed Noxious Weed.

Foxtail or Foxtail barley.—
Introduced from southern Europe.
Seeds tend to stick to clothing and
fur and can be deadly to pets.



←Silverleaf nightshade. Peren-
nial, native to the United States.
Produces small, round orange fruit
and is covered with short thorns.

Russian knapweed.—
Perennial native to Eurasia. It
forms dense colonies and spreads
adventitious shoots from widely
spreading black roots. Can be
toxic in large quantities. This one
is also a listed Noxious Weed.
