How to Apply:

- 1. Call 575-418-5979 or stop by our office at 103 Francisco de Avondo.**
- 2. We will survey and design your project for you at no cost.**
- 3. Fill out our simple application and be approved in a board meeting.**
- 4. Finish your project within 60 days and call us to certify it.**
- 5. We cut you a check!**

We are your local resource for conservation, and we are funded by your property tax dollars. This is one of the few ways you can actually get some of your hard earned dollars BACK and improve your farm or home at the same time.

You NEVER enter a contract with us; you can cancel at anytime, and we NEVER ask about your personal or farm finances, although agricultural cost share will be subject to 1099 forms at the end of the year.
